Kit review: Tamiya Nissan 370 Z by Associate Treasurer Tim Rhine

As a part of the Tamiya sports car series, the 1/24th Nissan 370Z Heritage Edition (kit no.24348-3700) was released in 2018. In typical Tamiya fashion the kit has a nice background information sheet to inform the builder about the history of the Nissan Z car.

Kit parts are molded in three colors: the body in yellow, the chassis in gray/silver and all interior parts in black. Clear parts are crystal clear and also supplied are red tail lights. Soft rubber tires, with no marking on them are also supplied. With these colors the kit can be built exactly like the box art rendition.

The instruction sheet is clear and easy to read with paint color callouts.

I have not started the build as of yet but it looks like it will be another great Tamiya kit and should assemble fairly easily. Based upon what I see, I would recommend this kit.

Look for a review of the built-up in a future newsletter.

Kit review: Tamiya FZR750R (OW01) by Guil Rosa

This is an old 1/12th scale model kit from Tamiya manufactured back in 1989. I bought this kit not long after I finished building my first motorcycle kit, the Honda VFR750R that you read about a few Newsletters ago.

This model kit consist of four (4) sprues, one of them made out of clear plastic, two (2) rubber like tires, thin and thick vinyl tubing, a spring, some screws, a Phillips screwdriver and a decal sheet.

After I studied the instructions, I started to make holes on the brake discs, what a job! After I cleaned up the parts, I shot some primer and when everything was ok, I started to paint the parts. I deviated from the instructions and decided to use Tamiya's Pearl White as the main color and also I used Bright Red on the rear wheel. One thing that I did for the fist time was to use Bondic resin UV cure (https://notaglue.com) for the dashboard dials. I do recommend this system; it works very well.

An old kit means old decals and old decals means headaches! They were very fragile and I had many problems with them. The result was less than desirable and after shooting the clear coat, I ended up not using polishing pads, only the compounds from Tamiya along with wax.

Final assembly was a breeze without any problems. It is far from my best work but it was a good way to spend my winter days at home.


2021 Show - The Club Exhibition is still up in the air. Club Officers have decided to wait until at least the July Meeting to make a decision whether to have the Exhibition or not.

When you get the reply to your registration, just follow the instructions we provide regarding what kind of photos we need and where to send them, along with an entry form for each model.

We have a secure system in place so that you can safely send your photos - we even have a how-to created to help you take great shots with just the camera in your cell phone!

Our judging teams will then use the photos and info to judge the entries in each category.



STEP 3 - ENJOY THE SHOW

Once we get your entries, we'll post them and the information you provide to the correct category on this website in the Championship Section for you and the whole world to see!

On May 31, 2021 we will close submissions at midnight Phoenix time and begin judging. No additional entries will be accepted after that. But everyone can still view all the models! Around the end of June we will announce the winners on the website and send out the trophies by mail!

Kit review: Revell VW T1 Camper by Associate Treasurer Tim Rhine

Hello all. Here is my review of the 1/24th scale Revell VW T1 camper (kit no.07674, released in 2020) which contains 189 parts. This kit is rated as a skill level 5; for the skilled builder. It is in the Revell Germany packaging.


Looking at this kit it appears to be the same Revell kit that has been released a few times over the years. I built the original kit back it 2016 and it assembled well, with the multi-piece body being the biggest challenge.

Revell has added all the camper option items including a pop up top. There are a lot of options for this; it is a very detailed build. Assembly instructions are in the Revell Germany style (I personally don't like this format). Parts are molded in three colors: white, gray and silver. One small chrome tree and four, yes, four clear parts trees as well as four no-name soft rubber tires are also provided. All the parts are crisp and clean with absolutely no flash and minimal sink marks. Louvered side and back windows are a nice touch and appear to be well done.

Overall this appears to be a great kit and will be a highly detailed kit when assembled. It will take some time to build with all the detail painting that will need to be done. I'll write a build review of this kit in a future newsletter.

I do recommend this for the experienced builder otherwise proceed with patience and care.




